1. Welcome and Apologies.

2. Declarations of Interest.

6. D&G Councillor's Report.

7. Matters arising from the Minutes of the meeting 24th April.

a/ Energy Storage Scheme.

It was agreed that the potential benefits had been proven inadequate to progress the proposal any further at present. The Community Council may revisit the scheme if other communities who take it up find in beneficial.

Local Energy Scotland have agreed to keep us up to date with any changes to funding. SS will forward the full report to ACK for circulation to the public.

b/ Raynet

A rough estimate has been received, putting the total costs of the full installation including mast and equipment at about £2000. The proposal will be considered in more depth at the next meeting.

c/ Garden Lighting

Callum Edgar at the council has indicated that work will begin within the next couple of months. It was agreed to keep an eye on this as we are keen to have lighting in the garden before the winter.

d/ Repair to U172

The Roads Department have indicated that they intend to revisit this repair to complete to a higher standard but have not given a date. We wish the improvements to be completed before the winter.

d/ Lorg and Longburn

Contrary to information distributed at the SPEN meeting, Lorg wind farm is not consented.

Longburn application is on-going and should be determined soon. A consultation was held in the hall regarding the Lorg/Longburn grid connection on 25 and 26 April.

e/ Blackcraig Margree connection

Remains ongoing.

f/ Kendoon to Tongland Reinforcement project

A report from the second round of consultation has been published.

A further meeting of the CLG is planned for the 15th June in New Galloway Town Hall.

The following was also reported –

Shepherds Rigg and Stroanshalloch proposals are likely to be revisited within the next 2 years.

A decision is expected on Vattenfall's South Kyle project imminently.

The anemometer at Glenshimmeroch has been withdrawn.

The application for an anemometer at Cornharrow has been approved.

9. Deer trapped in Bow Burn Culvert.

It has been brought to the attention of the CC that roe deer are regularly becoming trapped in the culvert running along the Bow Burn access road owned by Scottish Power.

ACTION

ACK to email Scottish Power to see if they can prevent this from happening

10. BT Nuisance Calls.

It was reported that many people in the community are receiving frequent unsolicited sales and marketing phone calls.

ACTION

MH to investigate further and see if anything can be done.

11. Resilience Group Report.

The site for the shed has been excavated.

The Council has assured that the drains at the south end of the village will be dealt with by the end of the summer.

12. CCT Report.

There is a plan to offer secretarial services to community groups. The services will be provided by SCVS. We are to let CCT know if we are in need of such services.
