Church and manse. United with Carsphairn on 6 July 1930.

JAMES ALLAN (FUF, 112), died 16 June 1921.

CARSPHAIRN

After the local union on 6 July 1930, the St Ringan's manse was sold on 10 July 1931, and the church on 27 April 1938.

Church and hall, manse. Chancel added to church and stained glass windows as War Memorial, and in memory of the late Mr Osgood.
